

# Moving Day Packing & Prep Checklist



## To have on-hand during the day

Keys!!	<i>Keep old and new keys in a secure place (preferably on your body) so you'll have them when you need them.</i>	
Protective Gear	<i>Avoid scrapes &amp; dents with padding, extra cardboard pieces and blankets. If using movers, they might have these supplies available to use during the move.</i>	
Snacks & Hydration	<i>water, grab-and-go snacks and a few treats</i>	
Coffee supplies	<i>designated supplies for making coffee (or tea or matcha or whatever you prefer) packed separately</i>	
First Aid Kit	<i>bandages and other essentials to help deal with any minor scrapes and bumps.</i>	
Cash	<i>From tipping movers to sending someone to grab pizza for the crew, cash on hand can save time and make things easier on the day.</i>	
Tools	<i>Have a toolbox stocked with the essentials for taking apart and assembling furniture, or quick adjustments on cabinets/drawers</i>	
Chargers	<i>Keep essential electronic chargers together and easy to find to avoid low-battery blues.</i>	

## To pack and keep accessible for the new house

Toilet Paper	<i>Unpack a few rolls (as well as some hand soap and towels) first thing when you arrive.</i>	
Unboxing Gear	<i>Make yourself an unboxing kit filled with essentials like scissors, a craft knife, packing tape, garbage bags and cleaning supplies.</i>	
Overnight bags	<i>Toiletries, a change of clothes, prescription medications, contact lens solution, soap</i>	
Bedding & linens	<i>Duvets, pillows, sheets for each member of the family</i>	
Shower Curtain	<i>Does your new home need a shower curtain? Purchase &amp; set aside with other bathroom essentials</i>	
Pet Supplies	<i>food, their water bowl, special treats and favourite toys</i>	
Important Documents	<i>Unlikely needed on moving day, collect important documents like passports, birth certificates, medical records and financial documents and keep them separate and safe</i>
